Here are some quick facts about IEP and 504 plans to make sure your student is setup for success to showcase their smarts!

Each school and school district may differ slightly in their processes, but generally:

An IEP plan sets changes or accommodations related to learning. A 504 plan sets accommodations for success with the standard curriculum.

Speak with your child's school if you have any questions or concerns, then you can work with their team to develop a plan.

Here are some accommodations to consider that may help your student succeed in class:

- use of adaptive devices and/or assistive technology
- extra time allowed on tests and assignments
- note-taking assistance or notes provided in advance
- use of computer or dictation for written assignments


