Alayna was born without her left hand and forearm, yet she has found a passion for the aerial arts. She has showcased her talent at Hand Camp over the past two years and is fearless!



In response, this generous prosthetic company provided Alayna with a new attachment for her current prosthetic —one that isn't yet available on the market—as well as additional attachments for her to try. Carlynn's expertise and resourcefulness ensure that Alayna can continue to pursue her passion with confidence.

It was fascinating! As a result, I became a physical therapist. As I was nearing retirement, I began to coach Special Olympics Tennis. Simultaneously, I had a girlfriend who volunteered as a nurse at Hand Camp, and she would frequently tell me how wonderful Hand Camp was. My friend encouraged me to help with the tennis at Hand Camp. I contacted Ruthie and Dr. Dell regarding volunteering for Hand Camp, and the rest is history. After the first time volunteering with adaptive tennis, I was hooked! Viewing individuals that have a variety of upper limb challenges, with big smiles on their faces, playing tennis is a heartwarming experience. I truly look forward to Hand Camp every year!"




#### Treasure

### **WAYS TO GIVE**




As a reflection of John's spirit, many volunteers have served and continue to serve selflessly to make Hands to Love a success.

Looking for a fun and sensory-friendly activity for the holidays? Create this one-of-a-kind turkey with your **UNIQUE** limb!

#### **MATERIALS**

- Washable Paint
- Construction Paper
- · Marker or Pencil

#### **GETTING STARTED**

- 1. Set up an open and safe space at the table to sit down
- 2. Grab a fresh, blank sheet of white paper
- 3. **Paint the hand:** Paint the palm or the middle of the hand brown and each finger tip a different color
- 4. **Stamp the handprint:** Gently press the limb on the paper. Wait <u>10</u> seconds
- 5. Hold the paper down and **gently lift the limb up from the paper.** Make sure not to smear the paint
- 6. Once your turkey is dry, **draw your turkey face and legs** with a marker or pencil
- 7. Admire your UNIUQE turkey!
